

Leaf Pick up 2020

City of Munroe Falls leaf pick-up program is scheduled to begin the week of November 2nd for a six-week rotational period. The schedule allows for **two** passes for each street during this time.

Leaf Pick-up Guidelines:

- Place leaves at the curb or the “street-side” of your ditch **before 7:00 am on the Monday of your scheduled collection week**. Pick up cannot be guaranteed after this time. If you miss a pickup you will have to wait for the next scheduled pickup.
- Rake leaves to the edge of the roadway or back of curb. If there is a ditch put leaves on street side of ditch.
- Avoid placing leaf piles near trees, signs, mailboxes, fire hydrants and streetlights.
- Remove vehicles* from the street during collection week. Leaves under and behind parked cars will **not** be collected.
- Do not include material such as **trash, rocks, branches, twigs, brush, yard waste or grass clippings**. These items will damage the leaf vacuum machines. Leaves will **not** be collected if they contain any of the above items

The Munroe Falls Leaf Collection Program is intended only to collect leaves that have been properly bunched and placed at the roadway **within the right-of-way** for disposal during the six-week period. **DO NOT PILE LEAVES IN THE STREET OR OBSTRUCT TRAFFIC**

There is a very small window of opportunity to collect leaves from the time they fall until winter weather begins. Once the leaves are covered by snow or are frozen, the leaf vacuum machines can't collect them and service crews will attend to snow removal operations.

Alternative Leaf Disposal

It is better for the environment for leaves be allowed to naturally decompose. When cities provide leaf collection services, they are required by the Ohio EPA to properly compost if they can in accordance with EPA guidelines and regulations or have them removed by another company that will. This is the most cost-effective way for Munroe Falls to dispose of your leaves. You can help minimize municipal costs for these services by:

- Utilizing a mulching lawnmower and mulch leaves back into the lawn. This provides nutrients for your soil.
- Placing leaves in and around plant beds and under trees and shrubs. Again, this provides good nutrients for the soil and plants, while also providing insulation.
- Placing leaves in with your regular trash (not recycle bin). This may actually assist in the breakdown of other materials in landfills. Or bag them up for your trash hauler, but please try to keep the number of bags in one pick-up under 15.

The Ohio EPA maintains a list of registered compost facilities that accept yard waste. It may not be free of charge, but if you miss leaf pickup, or if your leaves came down later than your scheduled pickup date you can take leaves, branches and lawn waste to any registered composting facility that will accept it. Each facility has its own hours, fees, directions, and instructions for drop-off. Please contact a facility before bringing material to them.
